Chorus Welcomes Assistant Music Director, Extends Summer Learning Program to Six Weeks

Of the many great things that have happened recently in the life of the Chester Children's Chorus, the most significant was the appointment of Dan Beal as our new assistant music director.

The board and I had talked for some time about the need to expand our teaching capability to serve the growing Chorus program. Dan, a graduate of West Chester University with a background in public school music teaching, joined us at the beginning of the Summer Learning Program to work with the Training Chorus and Junior Choir. He very quickly won the hearts of both the children and the staff, and his boundless energy, optimism, and genuine musical talent have strengthened our program immeasurably. It's a pleasure to

work with Dan; we have already collaborated on a new musicianship curriculum that will accelerate the children's learning of musical skills.

In addition to working with the two youngest groups in the Chorus, Dan will provide classroom music instruction in three Chester elementary schools through our new Sing-to-Learn Partnership with the Chester Upland School District. (Story on p.2.)

As I write this, the sounds of our outrageously successful summer concerts are still vivid in my ears.

The children performed secular French Renaissance pieces with confidence and just a bit of humor. Our Michael Jackson tribute was a show-stopper: the Chorus

Sing-to-Learn Partnership Uses Music as Academic Resource in Eleven Chester Classrooms

An exciting new initiative this fall is our Sing-to-Learn Partnership with the Chester Upland School District. Through this partnership, our assistant music director, Dan Beal, is providing music as a curriculum resource in 11 kindergarten and first-grade classrooms at Columbus, Stetser, and Main Street schools. Sing-to-Learn focuses on using music and songs to help children learn

and practice academic skills in disciplines including reading, math, science, and social science. Dan is working with each classroom teacher to develop songs appropriate to the curriculum and the needs of the children in that class. Of course, the children are also becoming better musicians, learning to love singing, and building skills in listening and cooperation as they sing together.

sang, danced, played with the audience, and stoked the crowd to a fever pitch with their version of "Thriller," for which they donned 100 sets of vampire teeth.

We closed the concerts with the original social gospel music that has become our signature repertoire. We recorded the gospel sets at our May and July concerts to become our 15th Anniversary Album. The CD will be released Nov. 7 at a party at the Chester Upland School of the Arts. (Story on p.1.)

We added a sixth week to the Summer Learning Program, giving us a week after the concerts for the Science Fair, field trips, and our Summer Gala dance and drum performance. In those six weeks, we didn't just sing: we played piano—56 children took lessons!—danced, wrote poetry, swam, made puppets, read books, learned karate, tried tennis, did biology and chemistry experiments, looked at modern art, argued, made up, and just plain enjoyed each other's company. It was all wonderful—but the best part was that we sang a lot and sang really well.
