
Summary Statistics Class of 2019








Number of Degrees (BA + BS)






Percent of graduates earning double majors






Percent of Graduates by Gender








Percent of Graduates with One or More Majors in a Division

Percent of Swarthmore Graduates Earning Honors or Distinction


Number of Swarthmore Honors Graduates by Level of Honors

Top 10 Majors for the Class of 2019: *Female*








Number of 2019 MAJORS by Honors/Course
