

[Letter George W. Searle to Elihu Burritt, January 4, 1862]

Boston

4, January 1862

My dear Sir:

It has just occurred to me that you might without any doubt, procure the use of the Hall of the House of Representatives for an Evening [capitalization in the original] to deliver your address: and it seemed to me there could be no place so desireable [sic] . Mr. Amasa Walker could get it if you drop him a note or any one of the Representatives active from Worcester. Col. Bulloch is speaker: Deland A. Goddard, Samuel Souther, Joseph D. Daniels & John L. Murphy are members from Worcester. I hope you will see this the most feasible plan for a beginning.
