Funding through AmeriCorps:

- **Each Philly Fellow is a member of the AmeriCorps*VISTA program and receives a living stipend and education award, health insurance, transportation, furnishings, and a variety of opportunities to experience Philadelphia's exciting culture.

Leadership Development Programs:

- **Professional Development Workshops: Fellows build specific skills related to non-profit and community work. This is a comprehensive curriculum comprised of five training sessions throughout the year.
- **Leadership Development Dinners: Each month, Philly Fellows invites a civic leader from the region to join the fellows for an informal dinner. These sessions are a chance for the fellows to meet and learn from some of the city's most dynamic leaders in a wide variety of fields that relate to both their current and future jobs.
- **Civic Engagement Component: Throughout the year, Philly Fellows encourages the fellows' participation in a variety of civic engagement endeavors, including community events, volunteer activities, and social outings. Collaboration between fellows' placement agencies, as well as other non-profits throughout the city, is an integral part of this process.
