program welcomed thirtyseven new members to
the Chorus with 153 total
members singing on stage.

New classes were offered this year in drama and creative writing. In collaboration with the Scott Arboretum, rising fifth graders took a horticulture class, where they learned about recycling, sus-

tainable planting and cared for a garden on campus.

Forty-one students worked with several faculty and students of Swarthmore College's science departments and presented a multidisciplinary science fair.

As part of the Andrea Knox Summer

Reading Program, thirty volunteers from the community read with rising third graders.







A dance performance, "Same People, Different Rhythms," featured hiphop, modern, step and African dance numbers.

We bid a fond farewell to our Assistant Music Director, Dan Beal, who was a wonderful part of CCC for four years.

Despite the hottest days of the summer, the students were magical at the concerts. In addition to singing Handel, Rossini and Gilbert & Sullivan, John Alston also arranged a tribute to Stevie Wonder, and students Isis Dill and Kassandra Stevenson both had songs featured in the gospel music set.

Three Cheers for Handel!

his past school year was a real classical music triumph for the CCC. In the fall, we learned and performed all of Mozart's Requiem, and in the spring, our Barber of Seville overture performance stopped the show at both concerts and was greeted with standing ovations.

My classical music dilemma for the summer program was to find inspiring and fun pieces that we could learn in five weeks. Having already learned the "Hallelujah" Chorus, I thought we might try several more choruses from Handel's Messiah. Some are too difficult for us, but many hit the CCC classical music sweet spot: challenging, emotional, tuneful, and rhythmically exuberant.

Methodically, we began to tackle "Surely," "Glory To God," and "Their Sound is Gone Out." We learned "Surely" easily, and the children loved the anguished harmony and aggressive rhythm (which I explained

represents suffering and crucifixion). "Glory To God" was more difficult, and took two weeks of rehearsing boys and girls separately. I promised them that they would be thrilled when they could put it together. On the third Friday of summer camp, after a few false starts, the Concert Choir sang the entire chorus, and when they finished singing the last, glorious

section, "good will towards men," unprompted by me, they burst into spontaneous cheers! With enough love and rigor, Chester children, like all children, are capable of doing glorious things. Please show them that you are proud of what they do and have faith in their ability to make their city and world more beautiful.
