- Unless permission is obtained, Friends Historical Library allows photocopying for personal or educational purposes only. Certain restricted or fragile material cannot be copied. The Library may limit the number of pages or items that can be photocopied from any publication, manuscript collection, or archival group.
- Copyrighted material may only be reproduced in accordance with regulations as specified by copyright law. Researchers using the Library assume legal responsibility for observing these regulations.
- Reproductions of publications, manuscripts, photographs, and other library material
 cannot be used by researchers for publications without due regard for copyright and
 other legal restrictions. Permission to copy does not constitute permission to publish.
 Publication privileges may be secured only upon the joint authorization of the
 Curator of Friends Historical Library and the holder of the literary rights

Copyright Notice
