




Number of Graduates




Number of Degrees (BA + BS)





Percent of graduates earning double majors




Percent of Graduates by Gender

2011-2025 Graduates by Race/Ethnicity


Race/ethnicity coding changed on the federal level in 2011.

The blue race/ethnicity categories (American Indian/Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, Black or African American, and Hispanic) reflect Under-Represented Minority (URM) students.

Per federal guidelines, students who select the "Hispanic" ethnicity are counted as Hispanic students even if other races are also selected.


Students who select two or more races (and who do not select the "Hispanic" ethnicity) are counted as "Two or more races" students.

International Students are considered to be "Non Resident" regardless of what race/ethnicity they selected.




Percent of Graduates with One or More Majors in a Division




Number of Graduates by Type of Honors



Percent of Swarthmore Graduates Earning Honors or Distinction




Number of Swarthmore Honors Graduates by Level of Honors














