






Number of Degrees (BA + BS)




Percent of graduates earning double majors

2000-2022 Graduates by Race/Ethnicity

Race/ethnicity coding changed on the federal level in 2011. Data prior to 2011 has been crosswalked into the newer codes, but, as we are recoding, this is imperfect.


The blue race/ethnicity categories (American Indian/Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, Black or African American, and Hispanic) reflect Under-Represented Minority (URM) students.

Per federal guidelines, students who select the "Hispanic" ethnicity are counted as Hispanic students even if other races are also selected.


Students who select two or more races (and who do not select the "Hispanic" ethnicity) are counted as "Two or more races" students.


Students who have a Citizenship of "International" are considered to be "Non Resident" regardless of what race/ethnicity they selected.






Number of Swarthmore Honors Graduates by Level of Honors

Students with double majors are counted in both majors. Majors are presented under the most current nomenclature.




Top 10 Majors for the Class of 2022: *Female*In the event of a tie, more than 10 majors may be displayed




Number of 2022 MAJORS by Gender

Departmental & Interdisciplinary Majors (See next table for Special Majors)




Number of 2022 MAJORS by Gender

Special Majors




Number of 2022 MAJORS by Honors/Course
