

The Lang Center's Social Innovation Lab featured in *The Phoenix*

Excerpt:"In January 2017, the Social Innovation Lab at the Lang Center for Civic and Social Responsibility was created by visiting Lang Center

professor Denise Crossan. Its purpose is to extend the Lang Center's mission to promote engaged scholarship at Swarthmore. Currently, it is being used by groups from Chester and SwatTank as well as some Swarthmore student groups. One of the ways the lab is teaching these concepts is through Design Thinking trainings, which are courses about



how to create social projects relating to a particular field of interest. Recently, Crossan and fellows have been promoting the lab as a space for students to visit."

Professor Edwin Mayorga and 'Education in Our Barrios' Project Featured in *Al Día*

Excerpt: 'For Edwin Mayorga and the Latino youth that make up the Education in Our Barrios Philadelphia team, learning begins at home, in the 'barrio,' the neighborhood. // 'The project is premised on the idea that our communities and young people in particular are holders of very



important knowledge. They're never a blank slate when they enter a classroom,' said Mayorga, assistant professor of educational studies at Swarthmore College, who first launched Education in Our Barrios with a small group in East Harlem in 2013. // Mayorga explained that the goal of the participatory action research project is to create connection with self and community, allowing students to 'explore their own identities and relationship to their history.' Through that lens they are also able to examine community histories and Latinx communities in the United States, in a format that is designed to 'help them be rooted and develop a certain consciousness about the issues that are shaping their lives."



Internship Opportunity | Casa de Esperanza (Recent graduates only)

Casa de Esperanza, located in Houston, TX, provides residential care to children from birth through six who are in crisis due to abuse, neglect, or the effects of HIV. Care is provided in our neighborhood by our Hands of Hope interns. This program brings together approximately 25 young adults annually to live and work with some of our society's most vulnerable children. The Residential Program is the backbone of Casa de Esperanza, and at its core are the Hands of Hope Interns. Hands of Hope Interns commit one year to live and work with these vulnerable children in the Residential Program's agency foster homes. Responsibilities include daily care of the children, household management, and the coordination of medical appointments and therapy sessions. The Hands of Hope Interns also work with caseworkers, psychological

staff and community volunteers on a routine basis to ensure that the children in placement receive the highest quality of care.

We use a wide range of tools and strategies partnering with entrepreneurs and experts, parents and policymakers, advocates and administrators—to develop and execute innovative solutions that will spur change and promote equality. EC is looking for undergraduate interns for summer 2018! Interns have an opportunity to apply to up to two of the following teams: Social Innovation, Education Technology, Elemental, Elemental Excelerator, Engagement and Protocol, Immigration, Marketing and Communications, Organizational Development, Public Affairs, and XQ Institute School Support Team. Entrepreneur Associates conduct research to support entrepreneurs within the Entrepreneur Mentoring Program (EMP). College and University students gain valuable "real world" consulting experience by working with entrepreneurs, UIF staff, and mentors to move product and service ideas forward. Additionally, Associates have the opportunity to manage and mentor high school students that work within the EMP. There is not a standard work day for an Entrepreneur Associate. Every day is different based on the projects that participants have in the pipeline and the deadlines with these projects. This environment requires the student to be extremely flexible and proactive. Some tasks will include: Evaluating business viability via internal and external analysis; Grant and/or venture capital research; Business planning; Website development; Marketing strategy and implementation; Prototyping. Requirements for this position include: Self-motivated undergraduate students (rising juniors, current juniors and seniors), minimum 3.0 GPA, and able to commit to an internship
