Skill or Luck? Golf and Nobel Prizes

ABSTRACT

In 1996 Greg Norman suffered an epic collapse in the late rounds of the Masters Tournament. A new and precise definition of the ideas of “skill” and “luck” suggests that his collapse was to a degree predictable, and it has interesting implications within and beyond golf, as well as an unexpected connection with some Nobel Prizes.
